#### From our Minister:

I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth,
do you not perceive it?

I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert.

• Isaiah 43:19

Dear All,

Throughout the history of our faith, God has called men and women of all ages to step out on journeys into the unknown; and to open their hearts and minds to new experiences. Often in the most difficult of circumstances, ordinary people were asked to trust in God and embrace new ways of being, new ways of thinking, and new ways of expressing their faith. For God, Jeremiah was not too young to become a prophet; Sarah, not too old to become a mother; David, not too flawed to lead his people; Mary, not too lowly to be chosen as the mother of Jesus; Zacchaeus, not too short to see new horizons; and Saul, not too callous to change his heart. By trusting in God each one of them went on to enrich their relationship with God in ways that transformed their lives and the lives of others.

As the Church of Scotland faces the challenges of an uncertain future it will continue to depend on the faith of ordinary people who are prepared to trust in God and embrace new ways of being the Church. The congregation at Pilrig St. Paul's is being asked to embrace a new thing: A new parish with two buildings and two ministers working together in partnership. This new parish will be under the guidance and leadership of a new Kirk Session made up from an equal number of elders from Pilrig St. Paul's, Leith St. Andrew's and St. Margaret's. You will hear more about this process in the coming months.

By bringing together the resources of three congregations (both members and finances) the hope is that new approaches to worship, mission and ministry can be developed. One hope is that new forms of worship will be started at Pilrig St. Paul's, with an emphasis on the 25-44 age group who account for 50% of the local population numbers. The hope is that other new initiatives will also be developed, and members are encouraged to get involved and submit their thoughts and ideas. There will no doubt be challenges as we adapt to these new changes; but change we must if we hope to develop our witness and service to the people of Leith and beyond.

The history of our faith shows us that the lives of people grow and flourish, whenever they embrace God's call in changing circumstances and seek new ways to be disciples of faith, hope, and love in the world.

#### **UPDATE ON UNION OF THREE CHURCHES**

The Steering Group has continued to meet monthly and is made up of the clergy team plus two representatives from each congregation.

Rev Stewart Weaver, Convener of Deployment Group, attended the Steering Group on June 11 to discuss the Basis of Union, Basis of Team Ministry and Basis of Reviewable Charge. These draft documents have now been submitted to the national bodies for review – we have had word that, from a church law perspective, the draft Basis of Union and draft Basis of Team Ministry documents are fine. We're still waiting to hear back about the Basis of Reviewable Charge but are not anticipating that there will be any difficulty with those.

We'll now move forward to voting on these documents – all three Sessions and all three congregations need to do this in time for us to submit the final documents to Presbytery for approval at their meeting on 5 November.

The congregations will aim to unite on 1 January 2025.

Property Conveners and Treasurers in each congregation continue to work together on areas within their remit.

Since the last update, we have set up sub-groups with representatives from each congregation to consider different aspects of the union.

There are sub-groups in the following areas: the role of Ministerial Development staff, fellowship, pastoral care, Powerpoint/recording services, safeguarding, social media/website, transport and worship. We'd like to thank everyone who has volunteered to help us to progress with the union.

Please continue to pray for our three congregations as we navigate the challenges of uniting. With God's grace, we can work as a team to deliver mission to this area of Edinburgh
