Dear All,

In chapter 20: 17 - 36 of the Book of Acts, Paul gives his farewell message to the leaders from the Church in Ephesus before he heads off to pastures new in Jerusalem. This was a change that they needed to prepare for.

Although I'm not moving as far away as Paul did, I'm still heading off to pastures new, and as a result we too will be challenged with change.

Change isn't easy. It isn't supposed to be. That's often an important part of why we need it. In the face of our own change, perhaps we should let the advice from Paul be our guide? Although Paul doesn't know what the future holds for him in Jerusalem – he tells those he leaves behind that he is leaving in faith: -

- Faith that the Holy Spirit is leading and guiding him.
- Faith that he is doing Christ's work.
- Faith in the good news of God's grace.

Both you and I must trust ourselves to our faith as we go on different, yet similar, journeys. We too must have faith that the Holy Spirit is with us to guide us. Faith to pursue the work of Christ in whatever ways we can. And faith in the good news of God's grace.

As you enter yet another new chapter in the history of this congregation, stay alert to the opportunities that will arise for growing and developing your faith – and be ready to respond to them as I know you have done before.

If you are able and willing to drive a transit van, you will need to hold a full driving licence.


